Minokamo is divided into eight regions, with mountains in the north, and a plain in the south.



What is Minokamo like?

Minokamo City is located in the center of Gifu Prefecture, and is a city full of history and nature just one hour north of Nagoya.

In Minokamo, you can see original historical buildings in Ota-juku, the 51st Post Town on the Nakasendo Trail, a trail that linked Kyoto and Edo (now Tokyo) in the Edo Period (1600-1868). Walk around the post town and enjoy original Edo architecture, including the Waki-honjin Former Inn for Dignitaries, a registered Important Cultural Property. There is also the largest Long-Nosed Goblin Statue in Japan at an impressive 12 meters tall at Kobi-no-Tengusan, the gorgeous Koyama Kannon Temple that floats on an island in the Hida River, and many other spots that showcase the unique sights of Minokamo City.

At River Port Park Minokamo, Kenko-no-mori Health Forest, and Gifu-Seiryu Satoyama Park, you can enjoy river, mountain, and forest activities, with options for families and also more active types. There's something different to see in every season, and options for old and young.



Nakasendo Ota-juku Post Town

Ota-juku was the 51st of 69 post towns between Tokyo and Kyoto on the Nakasendo Trail. The river crossing at Ota-juku was known for being one of the three biggest challenges on the trail. As Ota-juku was the intersection between the Nakasendo, the Gujo-kaido and Hida-kaido trails, it flourished economically. You can walk around and enjoy the old architecture and see the original *masu-gata* turns.

Front Gate of the Main Inn for Dignitaries (Honjin)

In 1861, this gate was built in celebration of the marriage of Emperor Ninko's daughter, Princess Kazunomiya, to the 14th Shogun, Iemochi Tokuqawa. Approximately 6 feet across and built in the Yakuimon

style, this gate features a large gabled roof that covers a 3 foot wide fence on both sides. It is a significant piece of architecture, which adds to the majestic appearance of this former inn.

Masu-gata Turns

The entrances to the post towns were built with "masu-gata" 90-degree turns, and sometimes a stonewall curve to protect the town from enemy invasion and prevent outsiders from seeing the

fortifications inside the town. Along the trail, there are also strategically-placed slight bends to inhibit travelers from seeing too far ahead.



Yusenji Temple

This Buddhist temple belongs to the Rinzai sect. It contains monuments engraved with internationally renowned haiku written by Basho Matsuo, the most famous poet of the Edo Period, as well as waka poems composed by the famous author

Shoyo Tsubouchi and Hakushu Kitahara, who is regarded as one of the most popular and important poets in modern Japanese literature.

Secondary Inn for Dignitaries (Waki-honjin) -Hayashi Family Residence

The Hayashi Family Residence was the second best inn in Ota-juku. It was authorized by the government for the reception and accommodation of high ranking travelers during the Edo Period. The building dates back to 1769. The original architecture and Edo Period ambience of this old inn has been well preserved, and it has even been designated as an Important Cultural Property of Japan.

Ruins of the Ancient River Crossing at Ota and Petrified Wood Park

The partial flagstone floor of an ancient river crossing can be observed along the Nakasendo Highway in Ota-juku. In 1994, a tract of fossilized trees was discovered at the bottom of the Kiso River, and the area was developed into a park.

Nakasendo Ota-juku Kaikan Hall The best place to start your stroll around Nakasendo, with a free museum room where you can see the history and culture of Ota-juku from the Edo Period (1600-1868). There's also the *Yadorigi* Restaurant, serving local cuisine and produce, and a



souvenir shop with local goods and handicrafts.

Old Komatsuya Rest House

Built in the late Edo Period, Old Komatsuya was an inn used by travelers passing through Ota-juku. It now serves as a rest stop for tourists and is a Registered Tangible Cultural Property.

Japanese Waxwing



The Japanese waxwing (bombycilla japonica) is a migratory bird that comes to countries like Japan to pass the winter. It comes to the Nakasendo Kaikan Hall in Minokamo City to eat the fruit of the mistletoe that can be seen in the yard outside the hall. However, the migratory patterns are not stable, and some years they don't come at all, making this an unusual migratory bird.

Natural Attractions

Shimoyoneda Cherry Blossom Forest at Higashiyama Park





This 23-hectare park is a noted flower viewing site with a total of 5,700 flowering trees and 35 different types of plants. Weeping rosebud cherry, mountain cherry, Japanese Camellia, and Hydrangea are a few examples of flowering trees that can be seen at the park.



Gifu Seiryu-Satoyama Park





Also consider a BYO-ingredient BBQ in summer, with a charcoal grill that brings out the best from your ingredients prepared for you (Reservation essential), or a thrilling "treetop adventure" course strung up on wires in the canopy!

History and Culture

Minokamo City has a strong local culture that lies in its roots as a crossroads for river transportation and land thoroughfare in the Edo period. Minokamo flourished due to its location on the Hida and Kiso rivers, and the Nakasendo, Hida, and Gujo trails. What living history can you find here?



Shogenji Temple

Established in 1330, this historic temple is well-known for strict Zen discipline. A number of famed sports personalities, economic leaders, and famous political figures have undergone Zen training at this temple.

Kobi no Tengusan (Long-Nosed Goblin Shrine)



A multitude of Tengu statues are enshrined as messengers of the gods at Aranagikyo Shrine. Among these, the enormous 12-meter tall statue of Tengu is known as the largest statue of Tengu in Japan.

Koyama Kannon Temple

This statue of the goddess Kannon, which is enshrined at the Koyama Kannon Temple on an island on the Hida River is believed to possess protective powers. It was erected for the protection of Yoshinaka Kiso's late mother. Wakana Gozen.

Ryoanji Temple

Ryouan-ji Temple is famous for the rare architectural style of its belfry gate. The old bronze bell from the 14th century, also called the "Goose Bell" (height 113 centimeters; bell diameter 60.5 centimeters), hangs from the top of the gate. This bell has been designated as a Cultural Asset of Gifu Prefecture as it represents the industrial art techniques of the late 14th century.

Zuirin-ji Temple has also been called "Persimmon Temple," an honorary title given by Yoshitane Ashikaga, 10th Shogun of the Muromachi Shogunate, upon the occasion of the presentation of their local specialty product, "Hachiya Dried Persimmons," This temple houses a number of cultural assets including a 481 centimeter tall wooden Maitreya Buddha statue (the Great Buddha of Hachiya.)

Yamazaki Mazak Museum of Machine Tools



This specialist museum of "machine tools", machines that make other machines, is a rare gem even internationally. It boasts interactive activities, real functioning displays of historical machine tools, and augmented reality-enabled (AR) exhibits of iconic industrial products that were made with Yamazaki Mazak machine tools, such as steam locomotives, automobiles, and airplanes. There is a creative hands-on area, an area that lays out the fundamental principles of machine tool production, and even a display that showcases the "smart factory" of the near future, a factory that builds machine tools.

Inside, there are sculptures, an old Japanese house that farmed silkworms, and an observatory tower from which you can see a panorama of the surrounding mountains. In the permanent exhibitions, there is a rhinoceros mascot. There are exhibitions and workshops for all ages about archeology, history, art, as well as local and natural history. Finish it off with a moment of peace, gazing into the forest from the café.

Dojo Hachiya Dried Persimmons

In 2007, Dojo Hachiya Persimmons were nominated for the "Ark of Taste" established by Slow Food. in 2010, Dojo Hachiya Persimmons received the "True Goods from True Places" certification in 2017, they were granted the Geographical Indication Rights Protection Act

The Dojo (noble) Hachiya Dried Persimmons have a history of over 1,000 years and were offered to members of the imperial court and successive shogunates. Dojo Hachiya Persimmons have received broad acclaim: the gold medal prize at the 1904 Louisiana Purchase Exposition, the 2007 Slow Food Ark of Taste nomination, the 'True Goods from True Places' certification in 2010, and Geographical Indication Rights Protection Act registration in 2017. 
