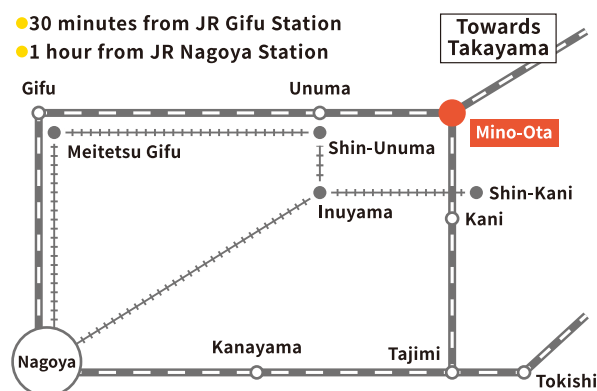

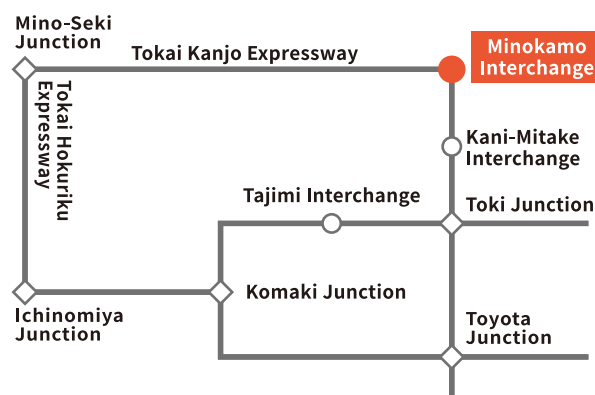
## Minokamo Tourist Route Map

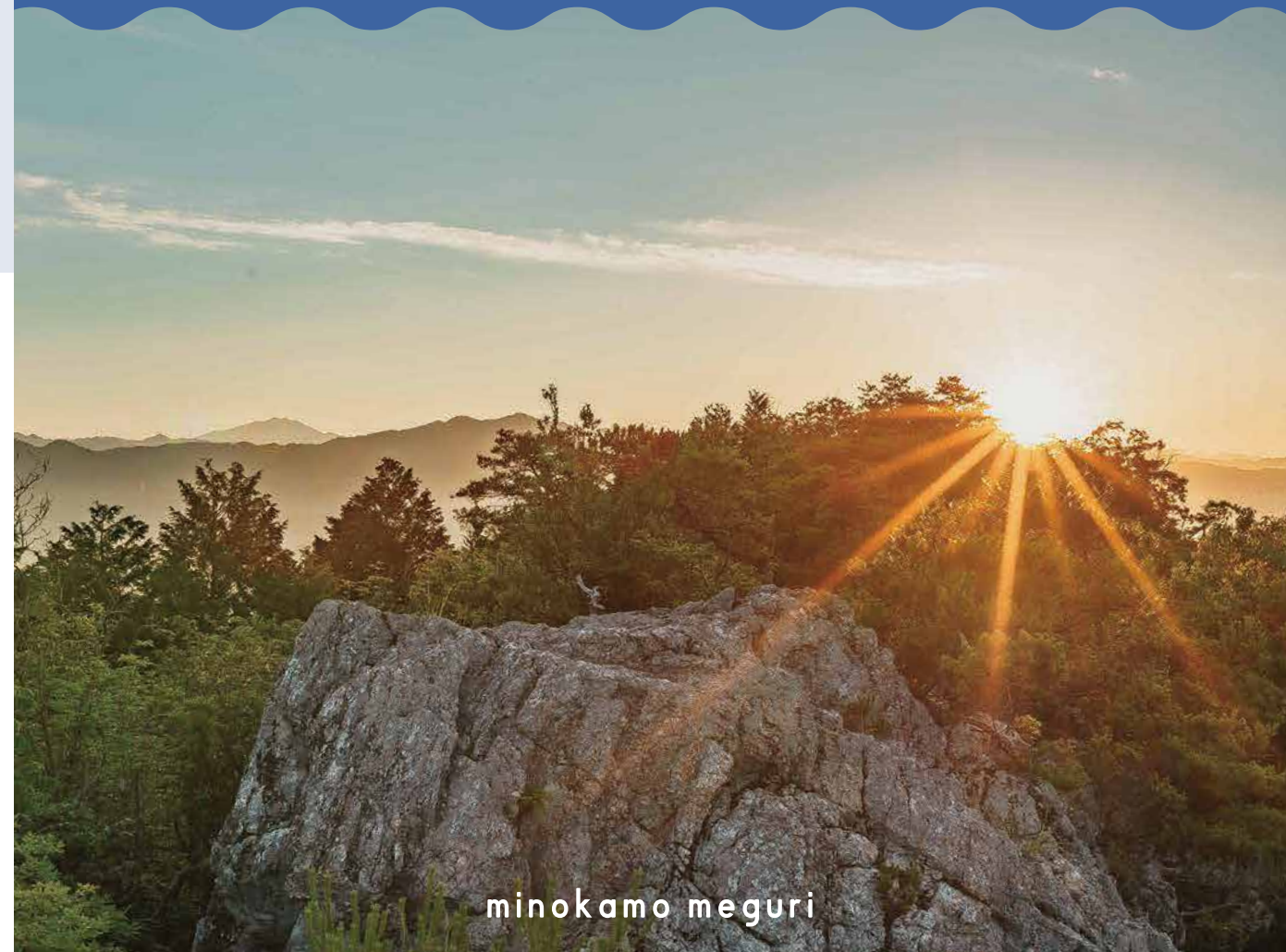

# Minokamo In Brief

Minokamo lies in the southern part of Gifu Prefecture, and is blessed with a rich history and lush nature. Ota-juku, the 51st Post Town on the Nakasendo Trail, is located along the Kiso River, and is a fantastic place to explore on foot as you soak in the historical feel of this area. There are also three expansive natural parks with hands-on experiences based around the rivers and forests, and a world-first machine tools museum to enjoy. In the northern part of Minokamo there is traditional agriculture and housing nestled between mountains; in the central part, fruit farming on the plateau; and the town center lies in the plains in the south—so there is a wide variety of natural landscapes and experiences to discover.

**Gifu-Seiryu Satoyama Park** 📍 🍽 🛒



A free park with a hotel and Michi-no-Eki (roadside pit stop with restaurants and shops) located at the Minokamo Interchange of the Tokai-Kanjo Expressway. At the park entrance, there is a Chari-kamo port to rent an electric bicycle.  
 Open every day from March through November; closed Wednesdays December through February. Opening Hours: 9:00-17:00 (from 10:00 December through February) Parking: Available, free.

**Mino-Ota Station (South Exit)** 📍



The main station of Minokamo and the gateway to your trip. It is the interchange between the JR Central Takayama Line, the Taita Line and the Nagarakawa Railway Etsumi-nan Line. You can rent Chari-kamo electric bicycles at Machi Bench Minokamo Lab, 100m south of the station.

Electric-Assisted Bicycle Rental Service

## CHARI-KAMO



You can rent an electric-assisted bicycle called a Chari-kamo at Machi Bench Mino-Ota Lab, just a brief walk south of Mino-Ota Station, at the River Port Park, or at Gifu-Seiryu Satoyama Park, the start and end points of the routes. You can zoom up the hills in no time thanks to the electric motor.

Note: To rent a bicycle, you need to register at Machi Bench Mino-Ota Lab or use the online membership registration form to make an advance booking.

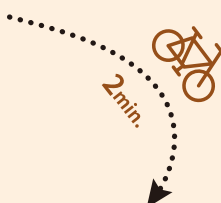

A shrine devoted to the Shinto deity of protection against plague, Gozu Tennō. Listen to the sounds of the woods and the water in calm serenity.

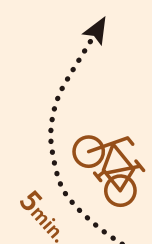

## 4 Shōgenji Temple

A temple renowned for its strict Zen Buddhist ascetic practice. Sports players and celebrities visit to practice Zen meditation.

## 5 Old Ibuka Town Hall Building

Registered as a National Tangible Cultural Property, this characteristic building displays the architectural accomplishments of the region in the early Showa Period (1936). You can enjoy coffee and snacks.

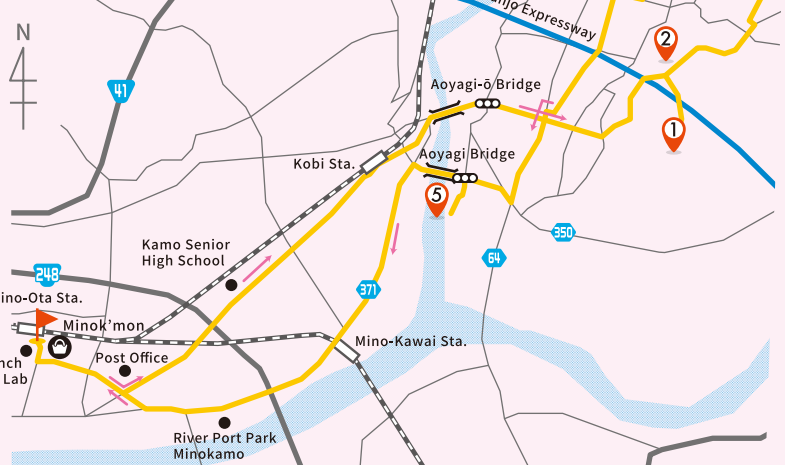


## 1 Mt. Yoneda Hakusan

## 3 Suwa Shrine

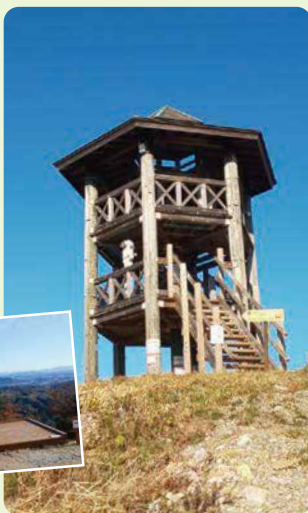

A walking path with kangaroo statues was built to celebrate Minokamo's 30th anniversary as a Sister City of Dubbo, Australia.

## 3 Petrified Wood Park and Ota Crossing Remains

The stone platform below the dock that once allowed visitors to cross the Kiso River by boat still remains. A large petrified wood forest was discovered in the riverbed.

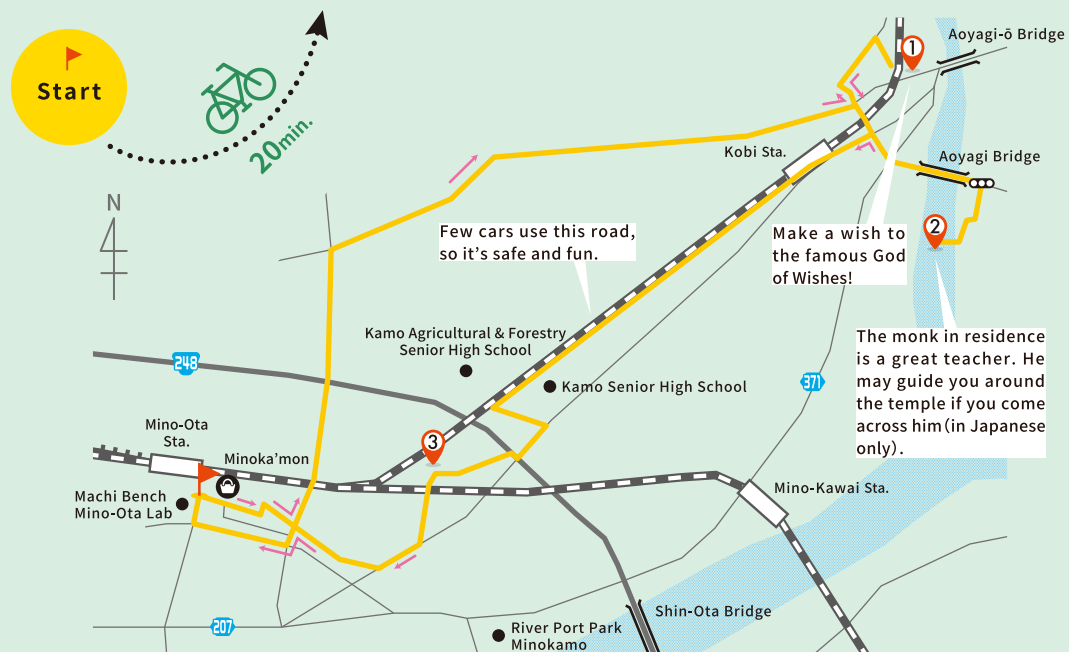
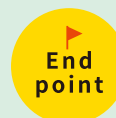
## 3 Kobi Shrine

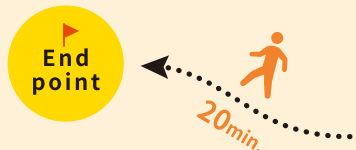

## 4 Front Gate of the Main Inn For Dignitaries (Honjin)

This gate was constructed for Princess Kazunomiya as she made her journey to Edo (now Tokyo) to marry the 14th Shogun, Tokugawa Iemochi. The materials and design laud the prosperity of the inn.

## 3 Secondary Inn for Dignitaries (Waki-honjin) – Hayashi Family Residence

Built in 1769, the building has been preserved to this day. It is registered as a National Important Cultural Property. The neighboring Inkyo-ya building is open to the public.

(Inkyo-ya) Closed: Mondays (the next day if Mon. is a public holiday), over New Year's  
(Omo-ya) Closed: Mondays, Wednesdays, over New Year's

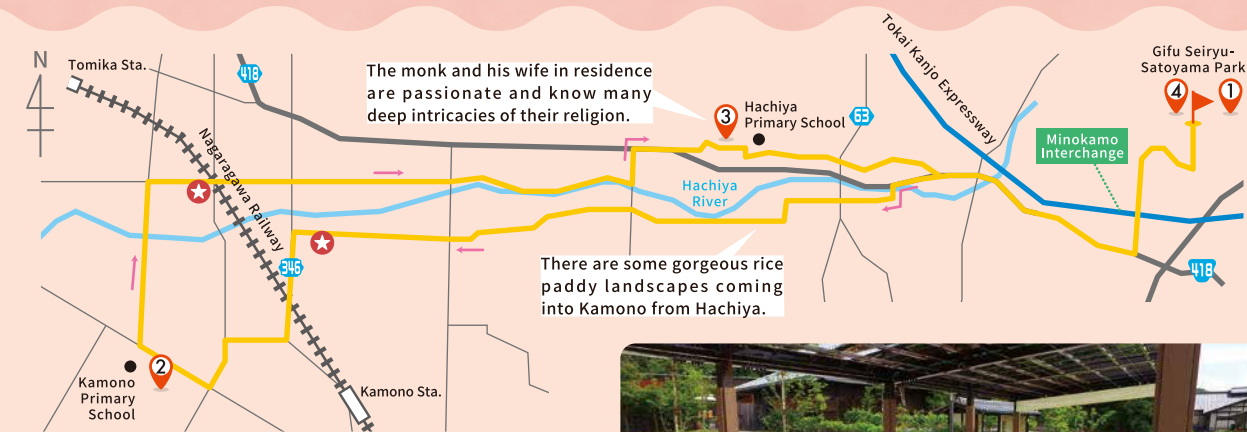

In the Muromachi era (early 14th to late 16th centuries), Dried Dojo-Hachiyagaki Persimmons were presented to the Shogun by this temple, earning it the nickname "Persimmon Temple".

A pond built after a famine has been made into a resting stop. Perfect for sitting while you eat Dango rice balls from the nearby shop.

# 10 Fruit and Art

Start and end point / Mino-Ota Station (South Exit)

## 1 Kobi Kinrin Park

Known for its emblematic pink octopus-shaped slide, the locals call it "Octopus Park". There are sculptures too. You can see cherry blossom from early to mid-April.

There is a sculpture on the lawn that inspires a fantastical dream of a fallen spaceship.

## 2 Yamanoue Tourist Fruit Farm

You can pick fruit yourself. In season, there is even an all-you-can-eat Nashi Pear experience with no time limit! Eat juicy fresh pears to your stomach's content.

## 5 Minokamo Bunka no Mori (Cultural Forest)

## 3 Yamaki Farm Cafe

## 4 Fruit Road

Yamanoue is an agricultural wonderland with pear farms as far as the eye can see. In harvest season from early August until November you can buy pears direct from the farms.

Note: Fruit sale depends on the seasonal harvest and may change from year to year.

Enjoy sweet Fuyu persimmons from mid to late November.



You will pass through beautiful rice paddies if you take the smaller roads.

In the evening, the setting sun over the pear trees is a gorgeous sight.
